#### What is an ESA?

An ESA is an account that allows qualified students to use base aid (approx. 1/4 of the average public school cost) in a manner that best fits their learning needs based on individual abilities, preferences, challenges, and goals.

# **Special Education**

\$72.3 million added for year 1 from the Governor's recommendation with required review of the formula in a special education funding taskforce

# **Teacher Pay Increase**

Requiring 50% of the scheduled CPI-U increase in 2024 to be used for teacher pay increases not to supplant planned increases.

#### **Public School Students**

Must qualify for free or reduced lunch (185% FPL) or be performing below grade level in math or ELA, English Language Arts (level 1 of 4) first 3 yrs

## **Non-public Students**

Year 1: 2,000 student cap, 300% FPL Year 2: 4,000 cap, 400% FPL Year 3: 8,000 cap, 400% FPL Year 4: No cap, 600% FPL

# **Implimentation Date**

Delayed one year: Program established in 2023 and makes availability of accounts in 2024–25

#### **Rural Schools**

Districts with 1A high schools permanently change formula from 2 previous years to 4 when determining headcount for calculation of state aid

## Who administers?

State treasurer administers the program with advisement from board comprised of legislators, parent, qualified school rep, and ex officio KSDE member & requires real-time access to accounts for maximum accountability & audits.

#### Conclusion

A bipartisan effort to bring together two key priorities. It puts Kansas kids in the heart of the debate & puts their unique needs as priority #1 while recognizing that not all kids can excel in a traditional learning environment.
