



# Kansas's Medicaid Program is Out of Control

# OBAMACARE EXPANSION WOULD EXPLODE KANSAS'S MEDICAID PROGRAM EVEN MORE



ObamaCare expansion states have enrolled **twice as many** able-bodied adults as promised. <sup>2</sup>



If Kansas expanded ObamaCare, at least 343,000 new able-bodied adults could enroll, costing taxpayers more than \$13B over 10 years.<sup>3</sup>

#### **OBAMACARE EXPANSION ISN'T WORKING**



There are **nearly 20 million** able-bodied adults on Medicaid as a result of expansion.<sup>4</sup>



**55%** are not working at all.<sup>5</sup>

### MEDICAID IS FAILING THE TRULY NEEDY



There are **6,799** truly needy individuals who are on Medicaid waiting lists in Kansas.<sup>6</sup>



**4,512**—or seven out of every 10—have developmental and intellectual disabilities.<sup>7</sup>



**2,287**—or three out of 10—have a physical disability.8

## **EXPANSION WOULD HURT KANSAS HOSPITALS**



\$12.5 million in Kansas hospital shortfalls, equal to 235 lost hospital jobs.<sup>9</sup>



Kansas has more hospital beds per capita than all nearby expansion states.<sup>10</sup>



In Arkansas, **hospitals have continued to close despite expansion**, while in Colorado hospital Medicaid shortfalls tripled after expansion. 11-12

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
